

# OUR CHARLIE CHAN FAMILY HOME'S NEW HOME: MOVING IS ALWAYS AN ADVENTURE!

Those who have ever been involved in moving either oneself or one's family from an established home to a new one know that it can be a lengthy prospect! First, there is the process of shopping for a new home. Then, following the choice of that home, there is the necessary phase of preparation. Following that, there is the actual move itself: the packing, the discarding, the transporting of household items, including prized possessions, carefully to the new home. If the old home is actually a museum that has been acquiring a collection of information for two decades, the prospect of a move is a daunting one, indeed, and began in earnest more than a year ago.

This has certainly been the case for our Charlie Chan Family Home as two troublesome issues became major factors in the decision to uproot and move. The first was that our present platform has been advancing toward eventual extinction as support from the parent company, Tripod, was being lifted. Also, there was only one Internet Service Provider, Internet Explorer, that allowed for simple editing without the editor in question, your humble servant, having a working knowledge in HTML. Which I don't! As it was announced that Internet Explorer was not long for this world, a change was needed as soon as possible.

Shopping around was not easy as those offering web site platforms seemed to all be geared toward businesses. Regardless, I tested a few and the results were far from satisfactory. Then, two of our Chan Family, Louise and HonoluLou (Lou), came to the rescue. It turned out that both currently used WordPress and both extolled the many virtues of that company. After a couple of tests, I felt that they were correct, although I knew very little about the ins and outs of building (or actually, RE-building a site) with WordPress, Louise and Lou were very generous with their expertise. As Lou has been involved in some big (and I will add, impressive) personal projects, I called on Louise often. She has been a gracious help to me as I stumbled through the process!

The first major thing attempted was a "migration" of the entire original site from Tripod to WordPress. This took some time to get off the ground...LOTS of time. Eventually, after much effort this came to pass, but it soon became apparent the time and money that had required went mostly for naught. It immediately became obvious that our new home would need to be constructed page-by-page. A daunting prospect, but a necessary road to trod. Thankfully, I was able to copy directly from our old site and paste to our new one. Of course, there has been the need to reformat everything and also make esthetic changes. One huge plus to this has been the blessing of a built-in teacher at WordPress named

"Grammarly." She has been pointing out typos that I made twenty years ago, and has chastised me for moments of less-then-desirable grammar. This alone has been a very humbling experience, as this old canine has had to learn some new tricks of the proper use of English!

As the Honorable Mr. Chan stated in *Charlie Chan's Secret*, "Live and learn..." I can assure everyone that there has been MUCH living and a LOT of *learning* as we have progressed toward the completion of our new home! Besides the wonderful contributions of Louise and Lou another teacher, Trial and Error, has been worthy taskmaster through all of this! Little by little the means with which to create our new home, piece-by-piece, image-by-image, has been taking place.

I admit that early on I was not sure that this could be happening at all. However, with all of the help I have mentioned as well as with the valued encouragement from all of our Charlie Chan Family members, it looks like we will make it to that finish line that seemed so distant not that long ago. Along with our new location, we will, as with all new homes, have a new address: charliechan.org. The old address (charliechan.info) will remain attached to our old home for the time being; it's hard to push that button to end something that has consumed both myself and all of you for so many years! Also, there will be need to bring over the final items from that site.

Our most used room in our home has been our Chat Room. This will be rebuilt and added to our new site, of course. At the time of this writing, options are being explored for the most user-friendly alternative.

As I type these words, there is still much work to be done to reach that final goal, which is to have the doors of our NEW Charlie Chan Family Home open by New Year's Day. Hopefully, as you read these words, this will have happened as fully as possible! Some of the furnishings may not be quite in place, and there will probably be some boxes – some big – to unpack, but 2023 should usher in the next chapter of our Charlie Chan Family Home, an online MUSEUM of collected Charlie Chan information.



Other RABBITS include: Eva Longoria, Frank Sinatra, Cesar Chavez, Anatoly Karpov, Tina Turner, Moshe Dayan and Orson Welles.

The RABBIT happens to be the "fourth" in the twelve animals of the Chinese zodiac. According to myth, the Jade Emperor called all animals of the universe together for a race. He decreed the first 12 animals to finish would be rewarded with a year dedicated in their honor, and according to the order in which they arrived. Rat was the first to arrive. He rode upon the back of the water buffalo (OX), and when they got to their destination, jumped off to finish first! The calendar repeats every 12 years. 

#### TO PUBLISH OR NOT TO PUBLISH—THAT IS THE QUESTION?



**To publish!** After a few legal reviews and a better understanding of the fair use clause, I decided it's time to publish the book I started many (many) years ago, *The Wisdom Within Earl Derr Biggers' Charlie Chan: The Original Aphorisms Inside the Charlie Chan Canon*. My hope is to release it on Earl's 139<sup>th</sup> birthday anniversary, August 26<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Much thanks goes out to the invaluable assistance of Biggers' biographer and author Barbara Gregorich. I hope you will find it an interesting read. It is a collection of some 175 aphorisms from the six novels, something I have never found before to be published.

Here is a small excerpt from my book's Foreword to whet the appetite as they say:

"It should be noted Biggers worked very hard to inject these words of wisdom within his novels through the voice of Charlie Chan. And it goes without saying Biggers borrowed these wise pontifications from a host of sources: To be or not to be (William Shakespeare's Hamlet, Act III, Scene I); The wages of sin is death (The Bible, Romans 6:28); Course food to eat, water to drink, and the bended elbow for a pillow—that is the definition of happiness in my country (K'ung Fu-Tzu, The Confucian Analects). Biggers was undoubtedly a student of philosophy, familiar with the greats; Lao-tzu, Buddha, Confucius, Diogenes, and Seneca to name a few. However, asserting the origin of these sagely words of wisdom is not the purpose of this collection. Rather, as previously stated it is to set to record the original aphorisms found within the novels."

"There exists much animosity surrounding the character of Charlie Chan. Primarily stemming from the fact Caucasians pre-dominantly portrayed the Chinese character on film resulting in a

white-man's version of "Chinese." So it is important to differentiate the "literature" from the antics of Hollywood film. While I enjoyed the Charlie Chan films of my youth, they cannot compare in significance to what the novels bring forth. Biggers' masterful prose and how he cleverly depicted the detective; his eloquence, intelligence, and the discrimination he faced and overcame. The novels were published in 23 languages, and it was in literature where Charlie Chan first attained celebrity and esteem. And with each new decade those literary works seem to vanish deeper into the archives of mystery writing. That's sad as Biggers novels played a significant part in the annals of the emerging American detective story in the early 20th century. However, cinema and circumstances eventually diminished his literary character to the point of producing the opposite effect of what the author attempted to accomplish—to correctly portray the Chinese as a wise, intelligent, people and nation."

Monday Evening Chat & Film Viewing (Jan 2): The question has come up regarding the presentation of the "extras" before our feature films that have been our custom for some years. What are your thoughts, please?

Originally, the early, 7:30 PM, eastern time start was for people to casually arrive and say "hello" and engage in small talk, etc. before the start of our movie at 8:15.
